SYSTEMIC THREAT CONVERGENCE: THE SIEGE LANDSCAPE



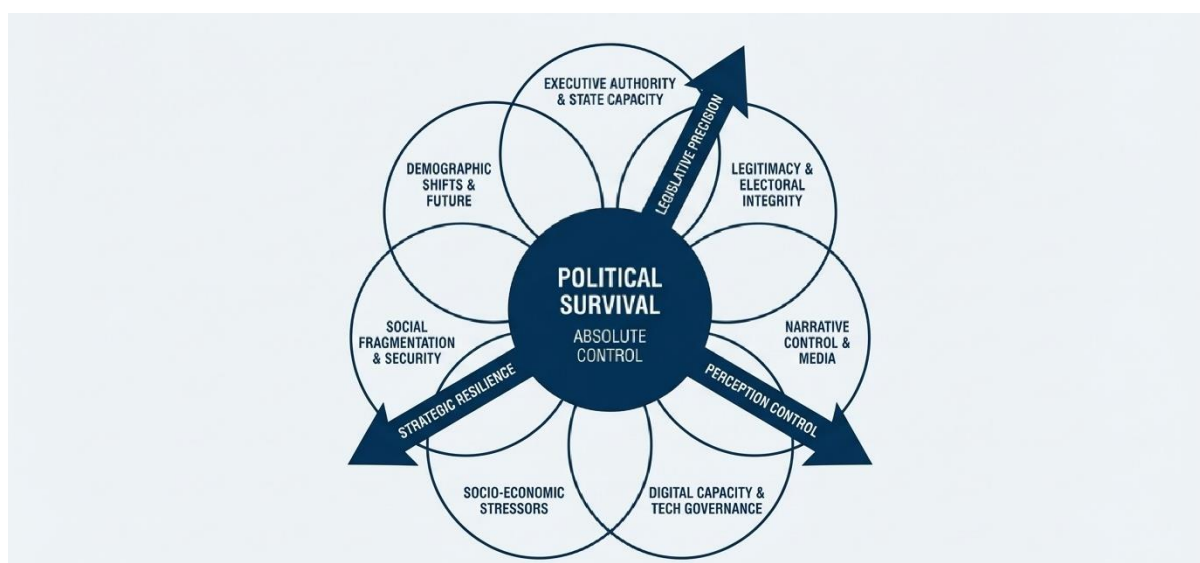

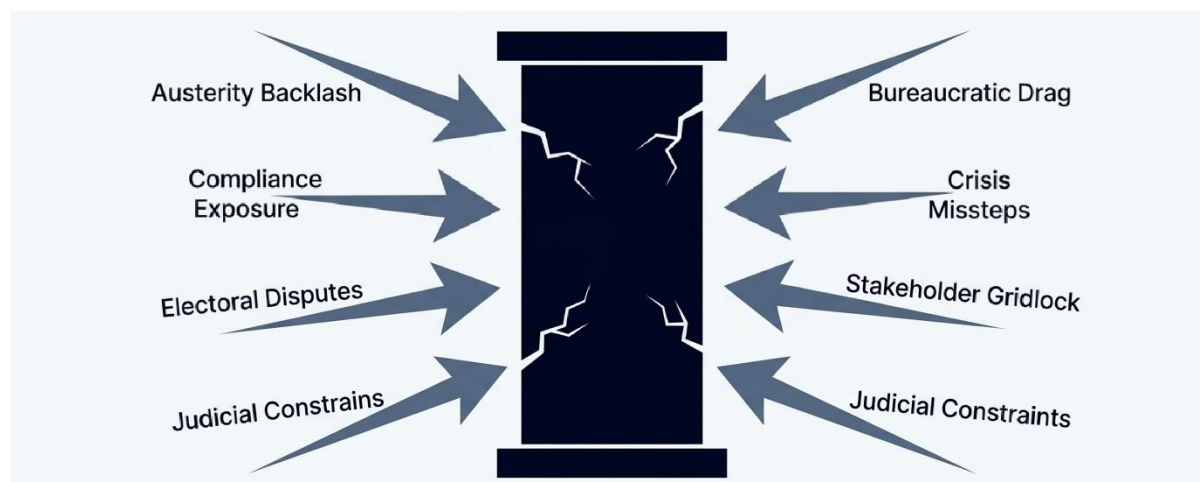

4.1 | EXECUTIVE POLITICAL AUTHORITY, STATE CAPACITY AND INSTITUTIONAL CONTROL

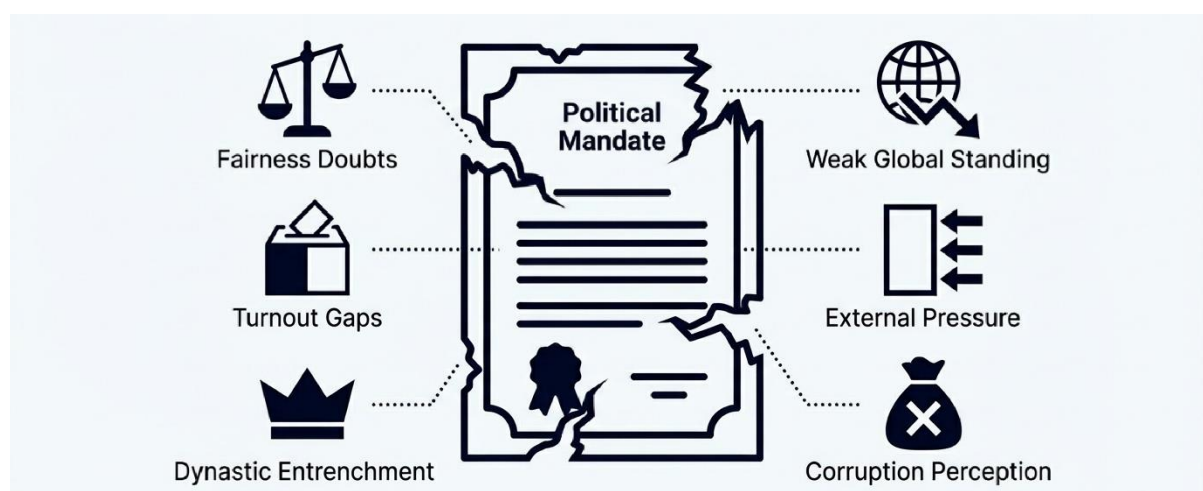

These vulnerabilities weaken your narrative control, and erode leadership credibility.
4.2.6	Corruption Perception Becomes a Strategic Liability	Pakistan's CPI score — 27/100 — continues to drive public disillusionment. In areas plagued by high-profile scandals, abstention climbs to 35%, shrinking your base and enabling opponents to define your image through association, and stereotyping.
